As our spirits lift and we shed the gloom of winter, let's remember those whose moods may not lift with the change of seasons. Those who suffer from mental illness, who live in poverty, or those who may be dealing with bullying and violence in their homes.

Educating the citizens of Licking County about these issues is what we here at Mental Health America of Licking County do, every chance we get. We provide this education in schools with PAVE (anti-bullying programming) and Suicide Prevention. We work with kids after school at the YES Club, giving them a wide range of activities, learning experiences and opportunities for service to help them become healthy, happy adults. We also offer adults the Bridges Out of Poverty program as well as help with parenting skills. Last, we help those with persistent mental illness to develop friendships in the Compeer program.

Mental Health America has just completed three projects to help raise awareness and funding: Share the Love Suicide Prevention and Awareness Event (February 15) raised \$1,200 and reached 10,000 people with a message of hope. Java & Jazz (March 2) raised \$33,000, which is essential for continuing current programming. The Eve Elliott Easter Project, which has been a yearly project for nearly 60 years, provided 3,276 individuals with Easter baskets.

Mental Health America has just launched a new fundraising campaign to support these various programs. It is called Mile of Quarters for Mental Health. Businesses, schools, community agencies, and churches all across Licking County are joining in, from April 1 to May 15, to collect \$3.00 from their students, customers, parishioners, and clients to purchase footprints that you will be seeing everywhere! We will wrap up with a celebration on Newark's downtown square on May 18th at 10:00 am. Awards will be given for most creative display, most feet towards the mile, etc.
